Betty Kohn Fieldhouse

MLC broke ground on a new athletic facility, the Betty Kohn Fieldhouse, in April. MLC administration, coaches, and students participated in the event, one which Rev. Richard Gurgel, MLC president, calls a milestone. "For many months," he says, "God was moving the hearts of our brothers and sisters around the synod—with their gifts and their prayers and their encouragement to others—to build a foundation, a financial one and a spiritual one, for this day."



A large gift from a donor family finished the funding and allowed construction to begin. The 36,000-square-foot indoor turfed facility, which features large practice areas, baseball/softball batting cages, golf simulators, and locker rooms, will support a year-round

physical education curriculum, enable spring sports to practice regularly, allow for additional intramural offerings, and create community connections. Students should be able to use the new athletic center by the beginning of 2022.

COMMENCEMENT 2021

On Saturday, May 15, 2021, 170 students earned degrees marking the completion of their ministerial training at Martin Luther College. This included 32 preseminary Bachelor of Arts degrees, 110 Bachelor of Science in Education degrees (including 18 early childhood education), nine Bachelor of Science degrees (including one staff ministry degree, six educational studies degrees, and two theological studies degrees), two seminary certifications, and one staff ministry certification.

In addition, 10 students received their Master of Science in Education degrees, five students earned their Master of Science in Educational Administration degrees, and one received a Master of Arts in Theological Studies.



ASSIGNMENTS TO THE MINISTRY

At the WELS call service on the MLC campus, there were 92 teacher candidates who indicated they were available to serve anywhere (66 from the graduating class and 26 from previous years), and all of them were assigned. In addition, 74 teacher candidates who were able to serve in a limited geographic area received calls, along with two staff ministry candidates. A total of 168 candidates were assigned. After the Assignment Committee met, there were still at least 90 vacancies for teacher-trained men and women synod-wide. Of those 90 vacancies, 57 submitted requests to the Assignment Committee that went unfilled.

FROM THE PRESIDENT

Taken from the commencement sermon by MLC President Rich Gurgel on the theme, "You Are Servants by and of Boundless Grace."

The sermon text chosen by the graduating class of 2021 was Ephesians 3:7-9:

I became a servant of this gospel by the gift of God's grace given me through the working of his power. Although I am less than the least of all the Lord's people, this grace was given me: to preach to the Gentiles the boundless riches of Christ, and to make plain to everyone the administration of this mystery, which for ages past was kept hidden in God, who created all things.

"I am so happy for the verse you chose as your class verse. The right people are listening to the right message. Your passage reminds you that the public ministry for which you have all studied, and into which many of you are about to be called, is a great privilege of grace to those who serve in it.

"He [God] wants you to grasp, as did Paul, the astounding difference between the depth of the sin of your heart and the depth of the grace in the heart of your Savior! All of which will lead you also to marvel with Paul, as you find yourself called into public ministry, what an astounding gift of grace that is! Though with Paul we must confess ourselves to be less than the least of God's people.

"When we recognize that we are servants of the gospel by boundless grace to us, we learn what it means to be servants of boundless grace to others.

"You who are a servant *by* boundless grace get to be a servant *of* boundless grace as you amaze the hearts of those you serve by showing them that where sin abounds, there grace always abounds more. Such is the boundless nature of the gospel of which you are a servant!"
